I. General Course Index (IGC)

EPGE ranked first nationwide in the evaluations of the [General Course Index \(IGC\)](#) of the Ministry of Education, nine times out of thirteen, encompassing more than 2,100 higher education institutions in all areas of knowledge.

The latest edition of IGC, related to the year 2019, was released on April 23, 2021 and it is available [here](#). Historically, in the thirteen IGC evaluations since 2007, EPGE ranked first nationwide in 2007, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019. It came second in three evaluations (2012, 2013 and 2014) and third in 2008.

II. National Student Performance Exam (ENADE) Evaluations

[Ranked first in three out of the five ENADE evaluations conducted by the Brazilian Education Ministry so far](#). These evaluations cover around 200 higher education institutions in the Brazil that offer economic programs. The latest ENADE evaluation, related to the year 2018, was released in October 2019.

In the five ENADE evaluations since 2006 (2006, 2009, 2012, 2015 and 2018), EPGE is ranked first nationwide in the area of economics in 2006, 2015 and 2018. No other institution has come top so many times in the area of economics.

EPGE has maximum scores from the Ministry of Education for all its programs (undergraduate, professional master's, academic master's and doctoral degrees).

V. Tilburg University's International Ranking

For many years, EPGE has been ranked as the best economics department in Latin America according to Tilburg University's [International Ranking of Economics Departments](#) (in line with its default selection of journals). EPGE maintains first ranked in Latin America in Tilburg University's International Ranking (news story, November 27, 2020)

EPGE has retained the top position among all economics departments in Latin America in the latest edition of Tilburg University's International Ranking. The School has now this status for more than 10 years.

Tilburg University's Ranking is widely regarded as one of the most respected in the world. It ranks the Best Economics schools based on, well-established criteria involving academic publications using an analysis of a database of the leading scientific journals in the field. The Ranking is frequently used to make international comparisons between economics departments across the world.

In the global ranking, EPGE has come 118th in the last two years. The top economics departments in the ranking include those affiliated with the London School of Economics, Harvard University, Stanford University, the University of Chicago, the University of California at Berkeley and Massachusetts Institute of Technology. In this global ranking, EPGE (118th) is rated better than some world-renowned economics departments such as those affiliated with George Washington University (123rd), Humboldt University of Berlin (123rd), Rice University (140th), the University of Hamburg (140th), the University of Bath (140th) and Barcelona Autonomous University (156th).

With regard to Latin America, the three best ranked economics departments are EPGE (118th), the economics department of the University of the Andes (130th) and the economics department of the Catholic University of Chile (181st).










VII. National Association of Graduate Economics Centers (ANPEC) National Selection Exam

The undergraduate program at EPGE Brazilian School of Economics and Finance (FGV EPGE) maintains its leadership in the National Association of Graduate Centers in Economics (ANPEC) Exam.

In the 2023 ANPEC Exam, FGV EPGE's undergraduate students achieved top position and ranked among the top five out of the top ten. With this result, the School achieves top position for the third time in the last six annual evaluations. Or for the fourth time, in the last six years, when considering only candidates from undergraduate economics courses.

The last six ANPEC exams had an average of 1001 qualified candidates across various higher education institutions. During this period, 27.5% of the students from EPGE who took the exam ranked among the top ten, a percentage more than five times higher than those presented by the other three centers with a maximum score of 7 from Capes (in descending order, 4.8%, 3.9%, and 3.8%).

The ANPEC Exam selects students for master's and doctoral programs in Economics throughout (across) the country.

XI. International Visits

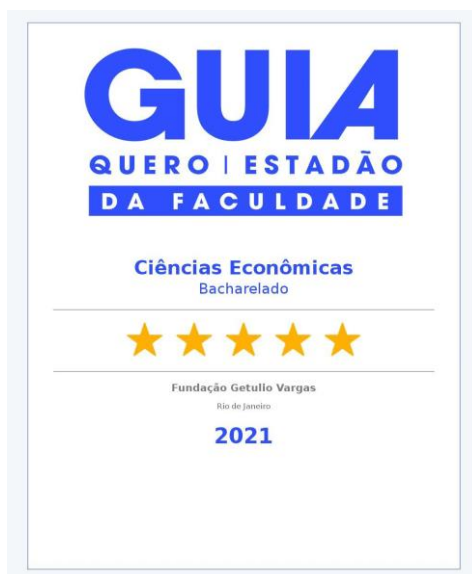

Professor Aloisio Araujo of EPGE receives 2020 Werner Baer Award (*news story, December 8, 2020*)

Professor Aloisio Araujo of Fundação Getulio Vargas' Brazilian School of Economics and Finance (FGV EPGE) is the winner of the 2020 Werner Baer Award. This was announced on December 7 at the opening ceremony of the 48th National Economics Meeting, held by ANPEC.

The Werner Baer Award, sponsored by the Lemann Foundation in partnership with the University of Illinois, pays tribute to the careers and legacies of renowned researchers. The aim is to recognize exceptional and transformational work, focused on Brazil's development, specifically in the areas of education economics, education funding, economics teaching and the role of science in the economy.

Aloisio Araujo is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences and American Economic Association. He is the vice dean of FGV EPGE and one of its professors, as well as an emeritus researcher at the Institute of Pure and Applied Mathematics (IMPA), a member of the Brazilian Academy of Science and a fellow of the Guggenheim Foundation, Econometric Society, Society for the Advancement of Economic Theory (of which he is a former president) and the Third World Academy of Sciences. In 1999, he received the Order of Scientific Merit from the president of Brazil. In 2019, he was appointed a special advisor to Brazil's economy minister.

Letícia Nunes, a doctoral student at Fundação Getulio Vargas' Brazilian School of Economics and Finance (FGV EPGE), won a 2020 Haralambos Simeonidis Award in the Dissertations category. The results were announced at the 48th National Economics Meeting, held by the National Association of Graduate Economics Centers (ANPEC).

Nunes started her doctorate at FGV EPGE in 2015, after doing an undergraduate degree and academic master's at the school. Her doctoral dissertation, titled Essays in

Health Economics, was produced under the guidance of Professor Francisco Costa of FGV EPGE.

The Haralambos Simeonidis Awards, created by ANPEC in 1982, are aimed at stimulating reflection and research regarding economics in Brazil. Every year, awards are given for the best papers in the categories of Articles, Books and Doctoral Dissertations.
