All nominated students will receive an email with the application instructions and practical information about the exchange program at Tilburg University. Students complete their application online. All required documents will need to be uploaded through the online application system. We do not require original documents any longer. Required documents:

1. Transcript of records (students who are in their master studies will have to upload both their bachelor and master grade list)
2. Copy of passport

Learning expectations



Instruction methods

A mix of (guest) lectures to a larger number of students and interactive seminars, workshops and tutorials with in-depth discussions in groups of between 10 and 40 students.

Assessment

Oral or written examinations (some courses have midterms as well), individual or group papers, essays, case studies, in-class presentations and other forms of coursework all count towards the final grade. At the end of each semester an examination period is scheduled.

Course Load

- Most courses are 6 ECTS (study load of 168 hours)
- Fulltime workload for one semester = 30 ECTS
- Regular workload for exchange students: 4 or 5 courses (24 – 30 ECTS)

Grading

In the Dutch grading system, grades from 1 up to 10 are used. In general, grades with one decimal are issued; the lowest passing at Tilburg University is a 6.0.

Cost of Living

Living in Tilburg is relatively inexpensive compared to some other Dutch university cities. The monthly cost of living is approximately €950 per month. Below is a general overview of your cost of living in Tilburg per month. These estimated costs can vary per person and also depend on your lifestyle.

A second-hand bicycle and lock will cost you about €125 and a university sports card can be obtained for €92 a semester.

Housing

Tilburg University does not offer in-campus student accommodation; however, WonenBregburg offers furnished accommodation to international students through www.yourroomintilburg.com. The estimated monthly rent lies between €450 and €570. The offer through this website is limited in **fall semester** (August – January); once all rooms are booked students will receive directions and instructions how to find accommodation through other accommodation platforms/agencies. We often receive questions if accommodation is available at Talent Square. Unfortunately, this type of housing is only available to degree seeking students and therefore not offered to exchange students.
